

Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Announces Re-parole for Eligible Afghan Arrivals

What: DHS accepts and considers re-parole requests for certain noncitizen Afghans paroled into the United States with the “OAR” or “PAR” classes of admission.

Who: Available for Afghan arrivals paroled into the United States between July 31, 2021, and Sept. 30, 2022, or those paroled into the United States after Sept. 30, 2022, with class of admission PAR or OAR.

You can find your class of admission on your I-94 form. See an example below.

Get Travel History

Effective April 26, 2013, DHS began automating the admission process. An alien lawfully admitted or paroled into the U.S. is no longer required to be in possession of a printed Form I-94. A record of admission printed from the CBP website constitutes a lawful record of admission. See 8 CFR § 1.405.
 If an employer, local, state or federal agency requests admission information, present your admission (I-94) number along with any additional required documents requested by that employer or agency.
 Note: For security reasons, we recommend that you close your browser after you have finished retrieving your I-94 number.

Class of Admission

If PAR or OAR is not listed as your class of admission, email OAWI94Adjustments@cbp.dhs.gov to request that your class of admission be updated. Get your most recent I-94 document from [USCIS \(Dari\)](#) [\(Pashto\)](#).

When: Afghan nationals with no approved or pending immigration status should file for re-parole before their initial parole expires.

Where: Sign up and apply online at the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Service’s (USCIS) website for myUSCIS: <https://my.uscis.gov/>.
